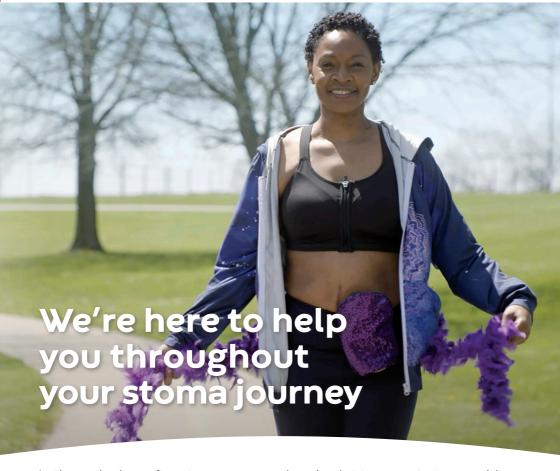

Relationship between fibre and reducing constipation

Fiber/Constipation

Constipation

- Constipation occurs when bowel movements become difficult or less frequent
- You are considered to be chronically constipated if you have two or more of the following for at least 3 months:
- Straining during a bowel movement more than 25% of the time
- Hard stools more than 25% of the time
- Incomplete evacuation more than 25% of the time
- Two or fewer bowel movements in a week

What causes constipation?

- Inadequate fluid intake
- Inadequate fibre
- A disruption of regular diet or
- Decreased activity or exercise
- Immobility
- † consumption of dairy products
- Stress
- Resisting the urge to defecate
- Pain from haemorrhoids/fissures
- Bowel cancer
- Hernias
- Overuse of laxatives
- Hypothyroidism
- Neurological conditions such as Parkinson's disease or multiple sclerosis
- Antacid medicines
- Medicines (especially narcotics, but also antidepressants, or iron supplements)
- Depression
- Eating disorders

Treatment of constipation

- Dietary changes such as increasing the amount of fibre in the daily diet 25-30g/day
- More fluids liquids help to plump out faeces, restrict the intake of diuretic

drinks such as tea, coffee and alcohol

- Fibre supplements these may be helpful if the person is reluctant or unable to include more wholegrain foods, fresh fruits or vegetables in their daily diet. As fibre supplements can aggravate or cause constipation if fluid intake is inadequate
- Exercise regular exercise improves bowel motility. Ideally, exercise should be taken every day for about 30 minutes
- Treatment for underlying disorder such as surgery to repair an abdominal hernia, hormone replacement therapy for hypothyroidism, or anaesthetic cream and sitz (salt water) baths for an anal fissure
- Laxatives there are two main types: bowel stimulants and agents that increase the water content of the stool
- Removal of the impacted faeces enemas, stool softeners and a shortterm course of laxatives or manual evacuation.

Medications for the treatment of constipation

Stool softeners/ (Emollients)

e.g. Coloxyl, Dulcolax

Side-effects:

Abdominal pain or cramps, nausea Lowers surface tension of the bowel, allowing water to enter the intestines Draws water into stool, making it softer May take 1-3 (up to 5 days) to work

Bulk-forming laxatives

e.g. Psyllium, Metamucil, Benefiber, ProNourish Normacol, Normafibe, Fybogel

Side-effects:

Bloating, flatus, need to drink fluids

 These are not digested but absorb liquid in the intestines and swell to form a soft, bulky stool

- Peristalsis is stimulated by the presence of the bulky mass
- Bulk forming laxatives are generally the first-choice treatment for mild constipation that has not improved with lifestyle measures.
- They can also be used to help prevent constipation in people at risk of constipation.

Osmotic laxatives

e.g. Movicol, Lactulose, sorbitol, glycerin, epsom salts, milk of magnesia, fleet enema, microlax

Picolax, picoprep, colonlytely (used for colonoscopy preparation and severe constipation)

Side-effects:

Flatus, cramps, dehydration, electrolyte imbalance, caution if suspected bowel obstruction.

- These laxatives are known as an osmotic laxative.
- This means that it works by rehydrating hard stools.
- Making them absorb more water from inside the bowel so they become softer.
- This induces a watery stool or bowel motion, usually within three hours, which normally removes the bowel contents.
- Caution with heart failure or renal failure, may cause electrolyte imbalance

Lubricant laxatives

- e.g. Paraffin oil, castor oil, olive oil
- Encourage bowel movements by coating the bowel and the stool mass with a waterproof film
- This keeps moisture in the stool
- The stool remains soft, and its passage is made easier
- Lubricant laxatives are taken by mouth

Stimulant laxatives

e.g. Senokot, Senna, Bisacodyl **Side-effects:**

Abdominal pain, cramping, diarrhoea, caution if suspected Bowel Obstruction

- Also known as contact laxatives, encourage bowel movements by acting on the intestinal wall
- They increase the muscle contractions that move along the stool mass
- Stimulant laxatives are a popular type of laxative for self-treatment ...but are more likely to cause side effects
- They are for short-term use
- Stimulant laxatives are dangerous, despite the fact that they are nonprescription medications.
- These are the most commonly abused laxatives.

Fibre

What is fibre?

- Fibre is the indigestible parts of plant foods, such as vegetables, fruits, grains, nuts, seeds and legumes.
- Fibre contributes to our digestive health, which can impact our immune system, mental health, disease risk and overall health in so many ways.

Why is fibre essential for your health?

- As a whole fibre, delivers a lot of health benefits:
- supports weight loss
- reduces cholesterol and blood sugar levels
- lowers risk of cardiovascular diseases such as stroke, heart disease, and more
- lowers risk of diabetes
- increases digestive and bowel health
- fuels healthy gut bacteria
- may lower risk of colorectal and breast cancer





What does lack of fibre cause?

- Irregular bowel movement
- Constipation
- Haemorrhoids
- Blood sugar fluctuations
- Feeling hungry soon after eating
- Feeling tired all the time and sluggish
- a rise in cholesterol levels
- Having a hard time losing weight

Types of fibre

- Dietary fibre is naturally present in plants that we eat.
- Added fibre is fibre that manufacturers add to some products to increase their health benefits.

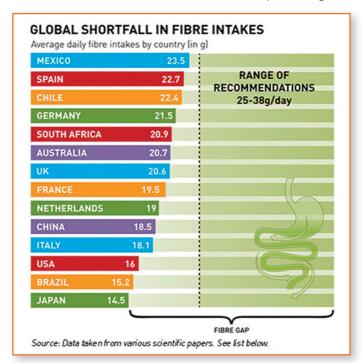
Soluble fibres

Soluble fibres are water soluble and therefore digestible.

 Soluble fibres come from the insides of plants and include substances such as pectin. They are present in fruits, vegetables, oats, and barley and may help manage blood sugar and cholesterol levels.

Insoluble fibres

- Insoluble fibres are not diaestible.
- Insoluble fibres come from the outer skins of plants and pass straight through the digestive system. They can help prevent constipation. Examples include bran, celery, whole grains, and seeds.



Fibre supplements

It's best to get fibre from food. Supplements don't have the vitamins, minerals and other nutrients that fibrerich foods do. But fibre supplements can be part of the daily intake. Fibre supplements can cause belly bloating and gas, at least at first.

We Remember an Incredible Woman: Josipa Triva, 106+ Years Young

t is with deep sadness that we pay our respects to our oldest ostomy member, Josipa, who has passed away at the remarkable age of 106.

Some of our readers may recall our 2023 article, where we highlighted that there is no age barrier to living your best life with a stoma. That story shone a light on Josipa and her close friend and interpreter, Melina. At the age of 105, just days after Christmas, Josipa underwent emergency surgery at Blacktown Hospital and had a stoma created. True to her resilient spirit, she embraced this new chapter of her life with courage and grace, never missing a beat.

Josipa once told me how much she loved learning and mastering new things, and her stoma was simply another challenge she accepted with quiet confidence. Throughout, she was supported by her beloved STN, Lesley Jack.

When I spoke to Melina after Josipa's passing, she shared that Josipa died peacefully in her sleep on 28 July. She would have turned 107 on 23 October. Melina continues to mourn the loss of her great friend, finding it difficult to believe she is gone, as Josipa remained so full of life—still championing the needs of others and even instructing nurses on how to care for her stoma right until the very end.

Melina delivered Josipa's eulogy and smiled as she recalled Josipa's



final touches: she had suggested what Melina should wear and even what to include in the speech! Ever organised, Josipa had arranged the food, flowers, and multiple wakes well before her passing. Every detail was thoughtfully planned and paid for, with four gatherings to take place—immediately after the ceremony, and then at 40 days, 6 months, and 12 months.

When I asked Melina what message she most wanted to share about Josipa, she said that Josipa was always looking for ways to brighten the lives of others. No matter what life presented, she sought out the good in people and situations. She believed deeply in showing respect by looking people in the eye, listening with kindness, and

standing up firmly when something was not right.

It is in moments of great loss that we realise how limited words can be, and how truly special our friends are. We hope Melina will find comfort in knowing that her kindness, compassion, and unwavering friendship meant so much to Josipa.

The world is certainly a sadder place without her, but the joy, strength, and care she brought to others will live on.



I feel privileged to have met such a hardworking, honest, and admirable woman. May she rest in peace. Vale, Josipa.

Spreading Comfort, One Bear at a Time

The Story Behind Ostomy Support Bears

n 2018, Kelly Moss turned a personal moment of joy into a global movement. After retiring early due to severe arthritis, Kelly received a teddy bear with a stoma bag from her brother—a

gift that brought tears to her eyes. Having lived with an ostomy for 19 years, she was deeply moved by the bear's resemblance to her own experience and wanted others, especially children, to feel that same comfort and acceptance.

What began as a small donation to Perth Children's Hospital quickly grew. Encouraged by a stoma nurse and driven by the desire to make ostomy bears more accessible, Kelly reached out on Facebook for help. The response



was overwhelming: donations of materials poured in, and volunteers stepped up to sew.

In her first year, Kelly sent out over 800 bears. Today, that number has surpassed 8,000, reaching children and adults across the globe. Her initiative is entirely not-for-profit—each bear purchased funds

the creation of another. She now has a dedicated "bear room" filled with donated bears waiting to be dressed with real ostomy bags.

Kelly customizes each bear to reflect different ostomy types—right-sided, left-sided, or double—and uses real, donated medical supplies. Despite the physical challenges of arthritis, she continues to craft these bears with love and determination.











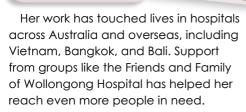




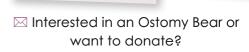

THE NATIONAL PUBLIC TOILET MAP

The National Public Toilet Map shows the location of more than 16,000 public and private public toilet facilities across Australia

Details of toilet facilities can also be found along major travel routes and for shorter journeys as well. Useful information is provided about each toilet, such as location, opening hours, baby change room availability, and accessibility for people with disabilities and details of other nearby toilets.

The Toilet Map is funded by the Australian Government Department of Health as part of the National Continence Program.



WHAT DOES THE TOILET MAP DO?

The Toilet Map improves independence and quality of life for the estimated 3.8 million Australians who are affected by incontinence by providing:

- the location of the nearest public toilet
- details of opening hours, accessibility, parking and other features
- the capacity to plan toilet breaks for short or long journeys
- the ability to save toilet information and trip plans
- · access anytime using a mobile phone

It is also convenient for people with young families and those holidaying or travelling to new locations.



HOW DO I USE THE TOILET MAP?

- browse the map in a particular State/Territory
- Search for toilets by postcode, town or suburb, near a specific address or location such as a sports ground
- Plan a trip with the Trip Planner Enter your starting address and destination to get a turn by turn description for the quickest route and the toilets along the way

When you find toilets near an address, at a point of interest or at a latitude/longitude you can select additional toilet features and opening hours in the right hand column of the page.

There are a number of different features listed, including baby change facilities, sharps disposal, MLAK access (see below) and accessible parking.

Unfortunately, it is not possible to release hard copies of the Toilet Map information to the general public. The main reason is that the toilet information is updated on a regular basis and so a hard copy of toilet information would quickly become out of date. However, feel free to print out toilet information from your browser to take with you on your travels.

The National Public Toilet Map is also available on:-

- Any mobile phone with an Internet browser. Go to m.toiletmap.gov.au on your phone to be automatically directed to the mobile site.
- Apple's iPhone. Just go to the App Store on your iPhone or use iTunes to download the National Public Toilet Map App. It's free.
- You can also use the Toilet Map with a Global Positioning System (GPS).

MASTER LOCKSMITHS' ASSOCIATION KEY (MLAK)

MLAK stands for Master Locksmiths' Association Key. The MLAK is a master key that fits into specially designed locks allowing 24 hour a day access to public toilets. Eligible people (those with a disability and a letter of authorisation from a doctor, disability organisation, local council or community health centre) can purchase a key that opens all accessible toilets displaying the MLAK symbol.

NEED TO USE A WHEELCHAIR ACCESSIBLE TOILET?

Have you ever been too embarrassed to use a DISABLED TOILET when you have to change or empty your ostomy appliance? Or have you ever been challenged when entering or leaving a DISABLED TOILET (wheelchair accessible)?

Where available, a DISABLED TOILET will provide the privacy and space needed for an Ostomate to change or empty their appliance. However, to the general public most Ostomates do not appear as if they should be using them.

To help avoid such problems, **an information card** has been provided to all NSW Stoma Limited members. Keep the card in your wallet or purse for quick access if needed.

You can also show this card when asking to use the toilet at a shop, restaurant or other business. It doesn't guarantee access to their toilets (as every business has different health and safety rules), but it proves you have a genuine medical condition that requires the urgent use of a toilet. Many places will try to help you.

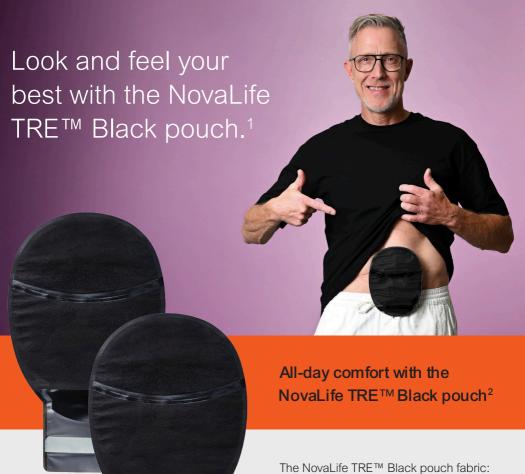
